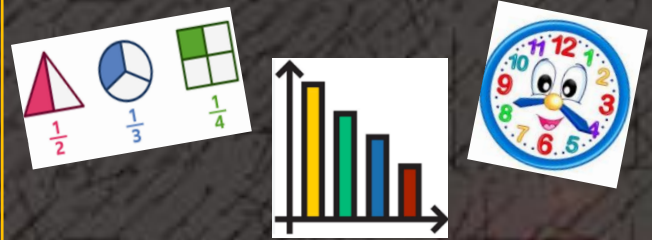
**History**
